Fall and Winter Safety Tips

The season for travel and family get togethers are upon us. We want to get you to and from your destination safely as well as have your home ready for visitors. Here are some general tips for you to keep in mind:

- Driving safely- be cautious of the road conditions. Wet leaves, rain, snow, and ice can
 create slippery roads as well as change normal visibility. Slow down and maintain a safe
 following distance.
- Monitor Weather Conditions- Fall and Winter can bring unpredictable and fast changing conditions. This includes rain, snow, and wind. Stay informed about local forecast and be prepared for sudden changes, especially if you are going to be outside.
- Fireplace and Heating- If you have a fireplace, make sure it has been cleaned and
 inspected before your first use. Keep anything flammable a safe distance away and
 never leave them burning unattended. This is a general rule for space heaters also,
 maintain a safe distance from flammable materials and never leave them unattended.
- Candles- Candles, wax melts, or warmers add a cozy atmosphere to your home but
 they can be a big fire risk also. Keep them away from flammable materials and never
 leave them unattended. Extinguish or turn off fragrances before leaving your home or
 going to bed.

Make sure you have a fire extinguisher nearby as well as a working smoke and carbon monoxide detector.

Please use these few tips to help drive safe this winter.

Keep your tree watered and away from heat sources.

In Case of an Emergency

- Non-perishable food supply (5days worth)
- Cooking stove (with fuel)
- o Manual can opener
- Water (one gallon per person per day)
- $\circ \ \ \, \mathsf{Extra} \mathsf{\; pet \; food} \\$
- Toiletries
- o First aid kit
- o Any medications
- Change of clothing (for each family member)
- Portable radio
- Extra batteries
- o Sleeping bags or blankets
- o Flashlight
- o Candles
- Matches
- o Garbage bags
- Cash
- Important family documents (Insurance, id's, bank accounts)
- o Disinfectant/ hand sanitizer
- o Face masks/ gloves/ hats
- Solar USB battery bank (with power cords for mobile devices)
